Minister's Message



Dear Friends

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:1, 27 NIV)

If there is one thing we yearn for in life it is peace. Peace in the world, our country, our state, our church, our families and in our hearts. Most of the situations and circumstances that we find ourselves in we have no control over, but still, we worry and feel afraid. So where can we find peace amidst the storms and turbulence of life? It is Jesus who can bring calm to our lives. He calmed the stormy seas for his disciples who were afraid in their boat by standing up, rebuking the wind, and saying to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm (Mark 4:39 NIV).

When our TV screens or Facebook bombard us with images of war or the impact of COVID and major flooding we can feel overwhelmed and switch off to what else is happening around us. Our world, our communities, need us to step out and offer love and support in their time of need. It may be as a listening ear, financially supporting or physically helping when we can.

After two years of a world pandemic and more recently natural disasters of floods, volcanoes and earthquakes and a war between Russia and Ukraine we may lose sight of the other things that are happening in people's lives. Amidst all this turmoil and uncertainty people are still having accidents, diagnosed with illnesses, or dying. Life still goes on amidst the storms. How do we stop focussing on the world events and pinpoint the areas of need within our communities and circle of family, friends, neighbours, and fellow church members? During the storm, it is time to listen, to hear what is happening for others and offer our loving support.

It was in the midst of the storm that Jesus offered his support by calming the storm and bringing peace. It was in the lead up to his death on the cross that Jesus reminded his disciples that when he died, he would not leave them lost and alone, he would leave them the gift of the Holy Spirit. We enter April with the last couple of weeks of Lent by continuing with our series on Discipleship Backyard Cricket, as we journey with Jesus to the cross where we once again will be confronted by the reality of the Easter story. In his time of pain and suffering Jesus looked beyond himself and offered his disciples and us a peace that the world cannot give and that there is no need to be afraid. He has not left us alone to travel through the difficulties of life. He is with us, loving and encouraging us to step out in faith into an unknown future.

Let us pray: Lord, sometimes we feel overwhelmed and don't know how we can help a hurting world. Open our hearts and minds to your concerns for our world. Lead us to places where we can still the storms of life for people who are hurting. Give us the courage to step out, 'making Christ visible' in our communities. Amen.
