Minister's Message



Dear Friends

The thief comes only in order to steal, kill, and destroy. I have come in order that you might have life—life in all its fullness.

(John 10:10 GNT)

Over the past couple of months, you may have noticed that I am not preaching every week like I was last year. Taking some time out from preaching each month is part of the memorandum of understanding between our parish and UnitingCare as it frees up some time for me to focus on Connect100. I am thankful for Maryan, Irene and Dawn J for their support in the worship services. I have heard good comments about what they have been doing and about how supportive you have all been. It is wonderful when people feel encouraged to use the gifts God has given them for the work of God's kingdom.

Some of you may have heard me talk about Connect100 and you may still be wondering what it's all about and what it means for our parish. For the past three months I have been the UnitingCare Connect100 coordinator in Maryborough. Essentially, this means that I now work four days a week as your minister and one day a week in the Connect100 initiative.

When change happens, it means that something has ended. What has ended for now is that I am no longer fulltime as your minister as I have other commitments. This other commitment does not take me away from the church but enables us to build a relationship with the UnitingCare agencies in our local area. It takes time to transition to what the new might look like for all of us and it is still early days. Some of you may remember the times when these local agencies were an outreach of our parish, and it may feel strange that they are now an outreach of the Uniting Church. You may still feel a little bereft when you think nostalgically of how things were in the past as the parish and the agencies were so deeply connected and interrelated. As you can imagine there have been many changes through the years since they became their own entities, now coming under the banner of UnitingCare Qld, but wanting to feel connected to us once again.

Part of my role is to visit the local Lifeline, UnitingCare and Blue Care offices, Blue Care's Respite Centre, and the Lifeline Shops to meet and get to know the staff and volunteers. Even though St Stephen's Hospital is now in Hervey Bay I have been working on that relationship since I started here last year, becoming a representative on their Consumer Advisory Group. More recently I have joined the new state-wide UnitingCare Customer Advisory Committee Hospital as the St Stephen's Hospital representative. This committee will meet on Zoom about four times a year with representatives from our four hospitals, The Wesley, St Andrews, St Stephens and Buderim Private, as well as members of the governing Board to discuss matters to improve health outcomes for patients.

UnitingCare's Purpose is to enable people to "live life in all its fullness" (John 10:10). UnitingCare states: We are committed to upholding and respecting the human rights of all people in everything that we do. We believe that a valued culture of freedom, respect, equality, and dignity for every person, is foundational to enabling all persons to live life in all its fullness. The Mission of UnitingCare is to improve the health and wellbeing of individuals, families, and communities as we:

REPORT ON 27 JUNE 2022 MEETING OF LEADERS COUNCIL

- Approval was given for the Girls Brigade Tombola to be held in Wesley Auditorium on 19th November.
- A review is underway into the flexibility for use of existing bequests held by the Parish. This matter was raised at the Special Parish Meeting in May.
- Sadly, our Verger and Pastoral Carer Shirley Ramsay – has had to give up these roles due to personal circumstances. Leaders Council recognizes the valuable contribution Shirley has quietly and lovingly made to the Church family over many years.
- \$3500 has been allocated from Synod flood relief funds to needy people in our area.
- Planning and promotion for the Hymn Festival on 9 July are well underway.
- Leaders met with Presbytery Minister Graham
 Huth on 25 June to prayerfully consider future
 directions for our Parish. Further meetings will be
 held.


