Minister's Message

Dear Friends

Do you see what this means—all these pioneers who blazed the way, all these veterans cheering us on? It means we'd better get on with it. Strip down, start running—and never quit! No extra spiritual fat, no parasitic sins. Keep your eyes on Jesus, who both began and finished this race we're in. Study how he did it. Because he never lost sight of where he was headed—that exhilarating finish in and with God—he could put up with anything along the way: Cross, shame, whatever. And now he's there, in the place of honour, right alongside God. When you find yourselves flagging in your faith, go over that story again, item by item, that long litany of hostility he ploughed through. That will shoot adrenaline into your souls! (Hebrews 12:1-3 The Message).

"What does your church do?" That's a good question that sometimes we might struggle to answer: "Well, we do church services and um, we have Breakfast Ministry and Girls' Brigade..." Perhaps when we answer like this, we may even feel a little embarrassed if we know how much some of the other churches do here in the region. I wonder if those 'pioneers who blazed the way' through the past nearly 160 years would groan and throw their hands up in disbelief? Maybe they would say: "What about Blue Care, Lifeline Telephone Crisis Support, Lifeline retail, Lifeline Community Recovery, St Stephen's Hospital, UnitingCare prison chaplains, UnitingCare counselling services? Isn't UnitingCare part of what our church does in our communities? Oh, and don't forget Head Space, they may be Wesley Mission Qld, but they are part of Brisbane's Albert St Uniting Church so still count as the work of the Uniting Church?"

When we answer in the former, we are viewing our church through a narrow vision, often forgetting that our churches aren't the only presence of the Uniting Church in Maryborough, Tiaro and Bauple. If we were to broaden our vision, we would answer in the latter and acknowledge what is done in our region in the name of the Uniting Church. Our church is not just our buildings or we the people who attend church each week. Our church has hundreds of people who work and volunteer each week and yes, some of us go to church. Our Mission Statement is: "Making Christ Visible." Our church is "making Christ visible" in so many ways each day that help support people in many different ways, such as; visiting them in prison, feeding those who are hungry, caring for people in their homes as they age, providing respite for the aged and those with a disability, providing face to face counselling for gambling, financial difficulties and family situations, telephone crisis support, mental health and medical care. This is our church in our region!

Paul, in his letter to the Hebrews, implores us to keep running the race, to persevere, never give up. Paul said: "Keep your eyes on Jesus... Study how he did it." By doing this, we will lift our flagging spirits and turn towards Him for our strength and courage to plough ahead through any difficulties we may encounter. Our spirits can lag when we remember the things we have done in the past, because what the church does today started locally as activities of our church. We might even deeply yearn to go back to our golden years. Paul doesn't tell us to look back, he tells us to look towards the finish line – "that exhilarating finish in and with God." Let us now begin a journey of looking towards the finish line and feel the presence of those "pioneers who blazed the way, all these veterans cheering us." We are not finished. Maybe we have been having a little rest along the way, taking a leisurely stroll instead of running and maybe we are feeling a little weary. I wonder what may happen if we look to the future by keeping our eyes fixed on Christ and that finish line if it will shoot adrenaline into our souls?
