

Minister's Message



Dear Friends

Call me "the Quester." I've been king over Israel in Jerusalem. I looked most carefully into everything, searched out all that is done on this earth. And let me tell you, there's not much to write home about. God hasn't made it easy for us. I've seen it all and it's nothing but smoke - smoke, and spitting into the wind. Life's a corkscrew that can't be straightened, A minus that won't add up. I said to myself, "I know more and I'm wiser than anyone before me in Jerusalem. I've stockpiled wisdom and knowledge." What I've finally concluded is that so-called wisdom and knowledge are mindless and witless - nothing but spitting into the wind. Much learning earns you much trouble. The more you know, the more you hurt." (Ecclesiastes 1:12-18 The Message)


I have been reminded lately about a song my Dad would sometimes sing when things kept happening that impacted his life and the world around him called 'Life gets tee-jus (tedious) don't it?' (Written by Carson Robison, also sung by Hank Williams and Tex Morton.) Sometimes life throws some curve balls or as the author of Ecclesiastes terms it in Eugene Peterson's translation: Life's a corkscrew that can't be straightened. Perhaps, just perhaps, life isn't meant to be something that we traverse easily or smoothly. We are always going to have times of

turmoil and upheaval, rough seas, when all we want are smooth seas with plain sailing. Life is meant to live and when we live we will have times of sorrow and pain.

I am reminded in the Quester's moaning's that when we read the paper or Facebook posts or watch the news on TV it can be that 'The more you know, the more you hurt.' The news has been filled of late with tragic car accidents, youth crime, stealing of property and cars and even Police being injured in their line of duty. It may seem that the world around us is in chaos and there is nothing good in it. It has been questioned through the ages as to whether this book should have been included in the Bible with its focus on the meaning of life, motives for behaviour and where God fits in our personal lives and the Church's mission in the world. What I like about the book of is that when I read the above passage, I can very much relate to it as it could have been written by someone today. When we read a passage such as this we may relate it to our own lives, but Eugene Peterson points out that the Quester is pastorally evaluating the state of religion in his time. He sums it up by using the Hebrew word translated to smoke. The Hebrew word connotes what is visible but unsubstantial, momentary, but without meaning whilst the word smoke can mean futility, spuriousness, illusion, or fraud.

When we get caught up in what we see as the state of the world around us, we can miss those everyday moments that show us that the world is a wonderful place to live. God has created an awesome world and we are blessed to be able to spend time in it. It is in the small everyday things that, if we have the eyes to see, we can see God working in the world. James 1:17 says: Every desirable and beneficial gift comes out of heaven. The gifts are rivers of light cascading down from the Father of Light. Every good thing, if traced back far enough, leads to the generous hand of God. It is good to give thanks and praise to a God who loves us through the tough times when we might forget that we are loved, we are forgiven and God is with us.


