

Minister's Message

Dear Friends

is anyone crying for help? God is listening, ready to rescue you. If your heart is broken, you'll find God right there; if you're kicked in the gut, he'll help you catch your breath. Disciples so often get into trouble; still. God is there every time.

(Psalm 34:17-19 The Message)

Who or what do you turn to in times of troubles or disappointment? We might turn to family or friends or fellow Christians or sometimes to some of the pleasures in life like food or drink to help us get through. We all have different ways of coping when something happens that causes us distress. When a crisis extends over many months of years, it can also impact our mental health.

Queensland's Mental Health Week runs from 7-15 October and during that week we will be 'UnitingFor Mental Health,' joining with Uniting Church agencies to have a presence at the Maryborough Markets and our church service on 15 October will have a mental health focus. You may know people who are struggling and crying out for help. Sometimes we may not even think to bring these matters before God. We can so easily forget in the busyness of life that God is listening and ready to help us through these times. We are not alone. God is beside us. encouraging us to be hopeful for the future.

At times we can be surrounded by multiple things that affect us deeply and we might struggle to catch our breath. We can feel overwhelmed with having to wait for decisions to be made, with outcomes not always what we might hope for. It is in the awfulness and painfulness of life that we draw comfort from the psalmist's: "If your heart is broken, you'll find God right there." Do you look for God in the life situations you find yourself in?

As a parish, we feel the pain for the members of Tiaro as their half is temporarily closed and a discernment commenced on a path ahead for the building. Decisions will be made for a temporary place of worship. We can make trite responses using the hyrics of a well-known song that says: "The church is not a building, the church is not a steeple, the church is not a resting-place, the church is a people! I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together! (TIS 467)" But this doesn't take away the pain of a decision like this. This can be seen as akin to losing our home. The church building can feel like a home. A place of welcome. A place where we belong. It's not easy to lose a building as it creates anxiety and there are lots of questions as to "What do we do next?" "Where can we go?" "How will church feel like in a different building?" Let us support each other through our times of trouble and heartache no matter what that might be for each of us. This is the church at its best when we surround those who are hurting with our love and support. This is what Jesus asks of us. God is there every time we are hurting. Let us be the presence of God in our world. We can make God's presence feel more real.

The Uniting Church in Australia REPORT on Meeting of LEADERS COUNCIL QUEENSLAND SYNOD 25 September 2023

Approval was given for the following:

- Temporary dosare of Tiaro Church Hall and investigation of an alternative worship venue, Leaders Council had become aware that there may be structural issues with the Hall and a structural engineer's assessment of the building was commissioned. It recommended that before further use of the Hall, significant work needs to be carried out; jack up the building to shift it beneatly to make the building square; re-level the sturnp supports; replace all internal Masonite wall sheets damaged by terrottes; replace several badly emitted steps/ramp treach. Costs incurred so fac: territe treatment \$2512, structural engineer's report \$2800, making a total of \$5332 ex GST. The building is no longer considered safe and itss been closed on the advice of Synool Insurance & Risk. Rev Delma will work with Tiaro members to identify a suitable location for worship. Leaders Council will enter into a period of discomment as to the path ahead.
- Regals of a box outlier and surrounding stoffind at Wesley Auditorium.
- Gevelopment of a <u>Volunteer form for special events</u> to be completed by those volunteers who only assist at those events eg set up for a Tombolia. This information is recurred for insurance purposes.
- An Event Abandance distance will be maintained by the Church Office to record the attendance numbers for Perish related events (excluding meetings) that have occurred during the month, commercing from Octaber 2023. These numbers are required for public liability insurance purposes. Co-ordinators of events will be required to provide the attendance numbers to the Church Office Secretary.
- Study leave for Rev Delma on 23-24 November 2023.
- Program planning by Girls Brigade for its <u>Tombala</u> to be held on 16 November in Wesley Auditorium.

Other matters discussed included

- The use of the Blue Card Portal as an administration tool to check the status of those volunteers who are associated with the Parish's Children's Ministry, ie Gats Brigade. Volunteers can apply/reapply in paper form or on-line but must present their Blue Cards to the Church Office to check that they are linked to the Rankh.
- We are awaiting the outcome of an inspection of suspected hall damage to the roof of St Stephen's Church.
- There are early positive responses to the invitation to participate in the Pestival of Christines Trees approved to be held from 30 th November to 3 rd.
 December, Parish groups are encouraged to advise the Church Office Secretary as soon as possible regarding their participation in the Festival, Publicity for the event is planned for the start of November.
