

# Minister's Message

Dear Friends

Jesus spoke all these things to the crowd in parables; he did not say anything to them without using a parable. So was fulfilled what was spoken through the prophet:

"I will open my mouth in parables, I will utter things hidden since the creation of the world."

(Matthew 13:34-35 NIV)

My people, hear my teaching; listen to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth with a parable; I will utter hidden things, things from of old — things we have heard and known, things our ancestors have told us.

(Psalm 78:1-2 NIV)

Have you ever been so immersed in a book that you didn't want to put it down? The story captivated you so much that you wanted to know what was going to happen next. You didn't want to miss out. We can feel the same about watching TV shows. Once we had to wait for the next week's episode to find out the next instalment of the story that was building in its intrigue. Then we would have to wait patiently for several months for the next series. In these days of instant gratification we can now binge stream season after season without having to wait impatiently. There is something in the waiting though that builds

our resilience and excitement. Waiting patiently for something to happen is not easy. Those pesky fruits of the spirit can be hard to live into. You can imagine people being so enthralled by Jesus' stories that they couldn't wait patiently for the off chance that one day he might visit their region again. So what did they do? They followed him from place to place. I don't think it is a bold statement to say that "Jesus was and still is the greatest storyteller of all time." He captivated his audience with his stories so much that news of him spread far and wide and people wanted to know more. It was through the power of story that Jesus changed the world. If there wasn't a real-life story to get his point across, he came up with a parable that told a fictious story that paralleled life situations and struggles. The parables tell a simple story that is used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson.

It is also good for us to tell stories, whether it is our life story, day to day life stories or the stories of our congregation. Our congregations have lots of stories to tell. When we might be feeling a little lost and struggling through changes, we can get stuck on the one painful story. It is good for us to sit and ponder, to remember the stories, good and not so good, that make up our lives and the life of our congregation. What stories could be told about our congregations? Would those stories just be stories of pain, or would there be feel good stories from past missional activities? Change is hard but to quote William Bridges: "It isn't the changes that do you in, it's the transitions." Story can be a powerful tool to help us transition from what is past to the new story of the future. In our church services we are transitioning from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. It is a journey through Lent that we take every year because the Lenten and Easter stories are what our faith is based on. It is through the storytelling of Jesus' life and ministry that we are continually called to take up our cross and follow Jesus through the ups and downs of our personal lives and the life of our congregations.

Jesus beckons us through his stories to follow him, learn from him and tell others about what he has done for us.


