

# MINISTER'S MESSAGE

## Dear Friends

"Don't be alarmed," he said. "I know you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is not here—he has been raised! Look, here is the place where he was placed. Now go and give this message to his disciples, including Peter: 'He is going to Galilee ahead of you; there you will see him, just as he told you." (Mark 16:6-7 GNT)

What do you hope for? Maybe you hope for peace in the world, your neighbourhood and family. You might hope for improved health, an end to homelessness or the abuse of children. There are many things we can hope for. The Israelites hoped for a Messiah for thousands of years. God had promised them that a king would be born to them. This hope got them through the exodus from Egypt and the exile in Babylon and the hundreds of years between their return to Jerusalem and the coming of Jesus. Waiting, watching and hoping that God was with them and that God had not abandoned them because of all their wrongdoings. Do we live in eternal hope that God has not abandoned us? Or do we feel that God is with us through the good, the bad and the ugly ups and downs of life? If we feel God is with us in our personal lives, I wonder if we feel that God is with our church? We are going through some tough times now. The weather and pests have impacted our buildings. For Tiaro this has meant that they can no longer gather in their hall and subsequently there will be the Tiaro closure church service on Saturday 6 April at 2:30pm. This will be a time of celebration as we remember the good times over the past 139 years of Christian witness on this property. It will also be a time of sadness as this significant era in our church history ends.

In our sadness, how do we grasp onto and find hope in Mark's telling of Jesus' resurrection? Jesus was crucified, he is not here, he has been raised, you will see him soon! This is the Christian eternal hope that we too will see Jesus. Do we look for Jesus? If we look hard and pay attention to what happens around us we might be able to see Jesus alive and working in our world. I find Jesus every Tuesday morning at our Breakfast Ministry and every Tuesday night at our Girls' Brigade. Jesus isn't always within the walls of the places where we hold our church services. Jesus is out in the world caring for the sick, the homeless, the lonely, the lost, the children. Jesus is spreading the good news that God is for everyone. Yes, God is for everyone. We can be Jesus' hands, feet and heart in the world. We can do this in just the little moments in life. Talking to someone, helping someone who is struggling, listening to someone, being a presence of comfort, love and hope. I encourage you to come and offer your love and support at the Tiaro closure church service. Let us love one another, support one another, uniting in the love of Christ. Let us be reminded that 'Christ is risen!' He is risen indeed! This is the message we are challenged to take out into all the world, beyond the church walls.




