Making Christ Visible Minister's Message

Dear Friends

But the Lord says, "Do not cling to events of the past or dwell on what happened long ago. Watch for the new thing I am going to do. It is happening already—you can see it now! I will make a road through the wilderness and give you streams of water there. (Isaiah 43:18-19 GNT)

Have you ever struggled with changes that are happening in the world, your family, your health, your finances or living arrangements? We all struggle with change, some of us more than others. Most of you will know how hard a change in your life circumstances can be. One minute life is travelling along smoothly and the next minute something happens that impacts your life and changes it forever. You might manage the change ok or you may struggle to adjust to the change. We all manage changes differently. There are many books written about how to manage change within our personal lives, businesses, organisations, or churches.

I recently read a quote by a church leader that gave me pause for thought. Cary Nieuwhof, minister, and author looked at the link between mission, method and change in churches. He explained that "a method is a way of doing things: programs the church runs, the style of music, the architecture of a building or facility, a staffing or church leadership structure (all of which cost money).

Have you got a notice to share?

Those are all simply methods that can and should change. The mission is what you're doing (like reaching people with the love and hope of Jesus), and it never changes. The more you focus on the mission, the easier it is to change the methods." Nieuwhof also says that "the reason change is so difficult in many churches is that members fall in love with the methods, not with the mission." It can be hard to let go of the things that tie us to the past. It is in the past that we may have good memories, even though if we are honest, we may be painting a rosier picture of what really happened.

Isaiah reminds us to not cling to the events of the past nor dwell on what happened long ago. When we cling to the past, we can lose sight of the future. The place we need to pay attention to is the present time for that is the only place we can glimpse what God is doing in the world. God goes before us, beckoning us to join into God's mission. When we look to the past, we can see the legacy left by past generations of members in our church eg St Stephen's Church and Hall, St Stephen's Hospital, Lifeline, BlueCare, Meals on Wheels. At our recent Mary Burnett Presbytery meeting our Presbytery Minister, Pastor Graham Huth, mentioned a quote about legacy that brings it into the present moment. Julie Funt writes that: "Legacy is a story about you that is yet to be written, but for which you hold the pen." If we hold the pen, I wonder what is the story we can write about our congregation that will be remembered in ten, twenty- or fifty-years' time? Maybe if we allow ourselves to dream and imagine a different future, anything will be possible with God by our side, God wants to lead us out of the wilderness into the streams of living water into abundant life working on God's mission in our community, 'making Christ visible.'

Report on Leaders' Council Meeting 22 July 2024


Approval was given for the following:

- Recommendation to go to the Annual Parish Meeting for a restructure of Leaders Council (now that the Parish has a single congregation).
- Congregation to be reminded of the exclusive use of a hall when hired by outside parties.
- Breakfast Ministry appeal to be conducted during August 2024.
- Prayer meeting to be initiated in response to Congregation feedback.

Leaders Council also noted:

- A Memorandum of Understanding with Connect100 has been signed.
- Auction of surplus items removed from Tiaro Hall has been conducted and funds raised are expected to cover the removal costs.
- Lease to Leslie G Ross Funeral Services for Chapel and catering room has been renewed.
- Current holders of keys to Wesley Auditorium will be contacted as part of the review of the Key Register.
