## MINISTER'S PASTORAL MESSAGE:

Dear Friends,

Are you creative? You may know people who are creative in music, needlework, cooking, gardening, woodwork, metalwork, sewing, knitting or crochet. I'm sure you can think of other creative activities that give joy to the people creating and those who may be fortunate to receive the fruits of their projects. I know I enjoyed admiring Mary's long stitch creations displayed in our church over Easter. Even though we mightn't think so, we are all creative. Without even trying we have built a great big colourful tapestry that tells the story of our life. Lyn Ungar wrote about weaving in 2020: "First set the warp, the plain, stable threads that hold the pattern in place – the infrastructure of joy, the girders that hold up all we build of meaning, or justice, or peace. Use strong threads left by those who have gone before. Only then pick up the weft, the coloured thread that you will use to weave accordingly to your plan. Choose carefully - this is what the world will see, each tiny act that builds the bright pattern of your life. Yes, the threads will tangle or knot or fray, and the flaws will show. Oh well. Tuck in the ends as best you can and start again. This is not the time to stop your weaving. So much is pulling at the great design." Our congregation has created a vivid tapestry of its own that includes mission activities in Maryborough. Some of that mission is still visible today, although not all is still in Maryborough. There was St Stephen's Hospital, Meals on Wheels, BlueCare, Lifeline (which has branched out into UnitingCare) and Girls' Brigade. Our congregation has woven a lot of love into its mission throughout the years that permeated into the community. But we didn't get stuck when the earlier missions moved on, we have woven a few newer missions into the tapestry like Breakfast Ministry (14 years), Chatty Tuesday (2 years), joined into BlueCare's Memory Support Café (2 years) and UnitingCare's Connect100+ initiative (3) years). As the poem says, what we weave won't be perfect but that is okay. We can start over again and again. Congregations aren't meant to stay the same, there is meant to be continual change as happens so rapidly in the world around us.


There is one thing though that never changes and that is the mission that Jesus continually sends us on: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35 NIV) As the world around us changes with the pressures of government legislation seeming to be constantly changing, the church may sometimes feel like our focus is on buildings, finances, governance and compliance. You might wonder where is the love in that? Recently some of our leadership attended Trinity College Qld's Congregational Risk and Safety short course online. In this course it was explained to us why we do Safe Church training and have a focus on risk assessments and managing risk. Yes, it may seem that the only reason we do these things is because we are worried that if an accident were to happen WorkPlace Health and Safety would enter our space, or that we mightn't be able to get Public Liability insurance coverage. Although this is an important aspect to the reasoning behind what Safe Church is about, it goes much deeper than that. For the Uniting Church, Safe Church has a deep theological foundation that underlies the processes and procedures. You see, Jesus mentioned love many times in the Bible, but there are other standout verses that also underpin our faith and how we are meant to treat others. Verses like: Do to others as you would have them do to you. (Luke 6:13), The second [commandment] is love your neighbour as yourself (Mark 12:31 NIV). Loving each other and those who interact with us are foundations for our Safe Church policies, processes and procedures. I know I like the concept of a 'Safe Church' where all who come feel safe emotionally, psychologically, spiritually and physically. To provide this safety we need to consider the safety of our buildings, our footpaths and how we do what we do as a church, including our mission activities. When we weave a tapestry with love in every thread, it is then that people will know that we are disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ, making Christ visible.
